



**DEWATERING INTO THE CITY
STORM WATER SYSTEM**
Permit Application Checklist

DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED WITH PERMIT APPLICATION

- Four (4) sets of Plans/Profile sections and details, drawn to scale, with 11”X17” as minimum paper size;
- Four (4) sets of the Engineer of Record, signed/sealed dewatering plan;
- Proof of DERM approved dewatering package;
- \$500.00 minimum bond/security: the determination will be made by the Public Works Engineering Division;
- Current Certificate of Insurance Liability/Workmen’s Compensation coverage to be approved by the City’s Risk Management Division;
- Copy of Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) *approved* permit package for roadway/lane closure for State roadways and right-of-ways;
- Certified Maintenance of Traffic Plan (MOT); (See *STANDARDS* below).
- Photographs of existing sidewalk/curb/gutter/asphalt pre-existing conditions.

OTHER DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED DURING THIS PROCESS

- Copy of Right of Way Permit and Plan on Job Site at all times during construction;

MINIMUM CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS FOR THIS PROJECT

The applicant must call Sunshine One Call of Florida at (800) 432-4770 and the Miami Beach Public Works Department at (305) 673-7080 to mark underground utilities located in the construction zone.

- F.D.O.T. Certified Flagman on-site during dewatering operation as determined by Public Works Engineering Division;
- Execution of Certified Maintenance of Traffic Plan (MOT) may require an off-duty Miami Beach Police Officer or F.D.O.T. Certified Flagman as determined by Public Works Engineering Division;
- Provide hay bales at the storm water inlet structures during dewatering operation
- Pedestrian ramp constructed over dewatering discharge pipe in Right-of- Way requires meeting (A.D.A.) American Disabilities Act approval for compliance to maintain pedestrian movement through the construction zone. Provide notification signage to read (caution: pedestrian ramp ahead) when utilizing sidewalk through the construction zone.

INSPECTIONS REQUIRED

- Sidewalk/curb and gutter
- Asphalt
- Storm water inlet structure
