From sunset to sunrise throughout April, Miami Beach City Hall, North Shore Bandshell, Historic City Hall, Pennsylvania Avenue parking garage, Julia Tuttle and 71 Street welcome entrance signs, and South Pointe Park's pylon lights will be shining in a blue light.

Miami Beach City Manager Jimmy L. Morales, whose daughter has a form of autism, said, "By shedding the light on autism, we can work towards improving the future of all those affected."

Light It Up Blue is a unique global initiative that kicks-off Autism Awareness Month and helps raise awareness about autism.
